► A new home... and a new family member

With a new baby and a new house, the future feels hopeful for Jesse's family

Jesse and his family, pictured below and at right, never could have predicted how timely their home purchase with Habitat Metro Denver would be. Their application was accepted in the same month as two big pieces of news – Jesse's wife, Isabel, found out she was pregnant with their first child, and sadly Isabel's mom was diagnosed with breast cancer.

"A lot happened at once. But at least we had hope that things were going to get better, and we knew we would soon have a house to come home to," said Jesse, who purchased a home at Aria Homes, Habitat's 28-home development in Northwest Denver. The family had been renting a house in Lakewood that needed constant repairs and felt increasingly cramped.

While completing sweat equity hours on Habitat construction sites, Jesse felt a strong connection with the Habitat Metro Denver staff and Core Volunteers. The team regularly asked for updates about their baby on the way.



Jesse and Isabel were thrilled to welcome their baby daughter, Rebecca, this spring, and Isabel's mom is also doing well and moving into the family's new home.

"Habitat staff and volunteers knew our story, and they checked in," Jesse said. "It feels great. I built a new home and built great relationships."

This year, we served 54 families through our new construction and renovated home programs.

New beginnings at Aria Denver

28 families join mixed-use, collaborative community

In June, we celebrated the completion of Aria Homes alongside 28 homeowner families. These homes sit next to affordable rentals and market rate for-sale homes to form Aria Denver, a 17.5-acre, mixed-use community imagined by the master developer Urban Ventures. Aria Denver serves as an example of smart density, where a mix of housing can welcome residents at varied income levels, and all community members can build connections and share resources. Aria Homes is the first Habitat Metro Denver development to be added to the Colorado Community Land Trust (CCLT), providing long-term affordability and benefits to homeowners.

Exciting progress at Miller Homes

Eight families to purchase affordable homes in Wheat Ridge

This summer, Habitat Metro Denver staff and volunteers made great progress on Miller Homes, a group of eight, three- and four-bedroom homes in Wheat Ridge. The units will include outdoor green space and are close to schools, businesses, and transit. If you volunteered with us at Miller Homes this year, thank you! Your support will ensure eight families — like the Gonzales family, at right — can purchase these homes with affordable mortgages and put down roots.



Habitat's Homeownership Program

sells homes to families with affordable, 30-year, fixed-rate mortgages, helping first-time homeowners enter the market and build equity. Jesse is a manager and driver for a restaurant. After feeling initially discouraged by the price of homeownership, he saw a Habitat home listed on a real estate app. He pooled the paperwork needed to apply and was approved. "It felt too good to be true," Jesse said. **"Habitat makes homeownership possible for families like ours."**

Thank you to our grant partners

Aria Homes would not have been possible without the investment of several community partners. Thank you to the Colorado Department of Local Affairs, the City of Denver, and the US Department of Housing and Urban Development for their financial partnerships. Because of their grant investments, 28 families were able to purchase these beautiful homes with affordable mortgages in a central, commuter-friendly part of Denver.

▶ **SAME HOME,
NEW CHAPTER**

Habitat home repairs helped this longtime Park Hill resident stay in the neighborhood she loves.

Patsy has lived in her home in Denver’s Park Hill neighborhood for 23 years. Recently, she noticed changes both inside and around her home. “My neighborhood has been gentrifying and I couldn’t keep up with repairs,” Patsy shares.

“The house was leaning where the bricks were cracked. I’d been so worried about the house because I could only afford ‘Band-Aid’ repairs on my own.”

Thanks to Habitat Metro Denver’s Home Repair program, Patsy’s home received critical updates that will allow her to remain in her home - and in her beloved neighborhood - for years to come. Habitat staff and volunteers rebuilt her fence, installed storm windows and doors, replaced cracked bricks, and painted her siding a blackberry color that Patsy chose.



“I’m in a great place now and I can stay and maintain my home,” Patsy said. “If it weren’t for Habitat, I could never have had all this work done. I’ll be forever grateful.”

▶ *A fresh start,
for home and health*

Thanks to Habitat’s support, one longtime homeowner and her daughter can more easily and safely connect with their neighbors.

Priscilla, 83, bought her four-bedroom home in Green Valley Ranch 25 years ago – making her one of the original homeowners in her cul-de-sac. But in recent years, due to health challenges, she has felt unsafe walking down her front steps to greet her neighbors.

Thanks to Habitat’s CAPABLE program, Priscilla received home modification updates and at-home health care that have helped her feel more independent and secure in her own space – and connect with her community again.

“Now, she feels much safer going down the front stairs to take a walk,” says her daughter Latanya, who moved in with her mother 10 years ago when she retired. “Mom loves greeting the neighbors. She is always waving and asking the neighbors about their families.”

When Habitat staff learned that Latanya was getting a hip replacement, they sped up the work they were



doing on the home – installing bathroom grab bars, a raised toilet, and sturdy railings next to the stairs, which would help mother and daughter navigate their home safely.

“Both mom and I feel safer and have more confidence climbing up and down the stairs now.”

“We also got to meet some really wonderful people. You can tell Habitat really cares about helping homeowners stay safe in their homes.”

This year, we served 77 seniors with home repairs and health support through the CAPABLE program.

Habitat’s Home Repair program engages Habitat staff and volunteers to make critical repairs that improve homeowners’ comfort, safety, and security. Homeowners pay about 10% of the cost of repairs, and the affordability of the program prevents longtime homeowners from being displaced from their neighborhoods. Projects often include updating roofing and siding, repairing foundations, and making energy-saving improvements, like replacing and re-sealing doors and windows, as volunteers did for Patsy. *“After they finished, the house was warmer and there was a big decrease in my energy bill,” Patsy said.*

Habitat’s Community Aging in Place – Advancing Better Living for Elders (CAPABLE) program

is a partnership between Habitat Metro Denver and the Colorado Visiting Nurse Association that provides occupational therapy, nursing and home repairs to improve comfort and mobility for low-income homeowners. “My mom has been taking showers for years, but she is so pleased that she can now take a bath if she wants because of the grab bars Habitat installed,” Latanya said. *“Both my mom and I are really grateful for Habitat and CAPABLE. They really make a difference in people’s lives.”*

Linda, pictured above, remembers first volunteering for the ReStores for a community service day, and after just one shift, “I was hooked!” she says.

Now, she has accrued over six years of volunteer time as a ReStore Core Volunteer – stocking shelves, moving inventory, checking out customers, and assisting Spanish-speaking patrons. Linda doesn’t consider her time at the ReStores “work” – instead, “it feeds your soul,” she says. And she gained a new community of friends and customers.

“I love seeing the regulars come into the store. That’s what is special about being a Core Volunteer – you get to know customers, and they look for you when they come in.”
